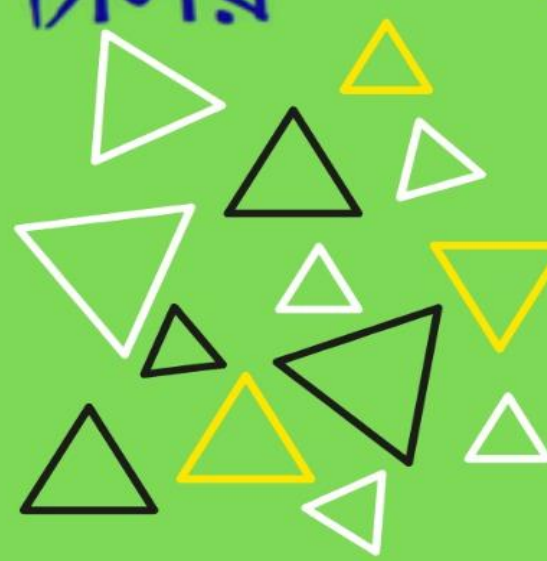

A Glimpse of Agia College

A) History of the College:

On an auspicious occasion on 22nd day of August, 1996, Agia College makes its existence temporarily at J.N. Memorial H.S. School building, Agia as a degree Arts college under the presidentship of Late Mahesh Ch. Nath, Secretaryship of Late Swahid Ray and Principalship of Dr. Monoj Kr. Chakraborty with five lecturers and twenty-nine students. Before its establishment the need for a Degree Arts College at Agia had for a long time been igniting the minds of the people here and also the remote neighbouring areas, as there were no college within a radius of 12 to 15 km, the need for such higher institution has been seriously felt.

Accordingly, the first meeting was held at Agia on 24th January, 1982 being chaired by Late Nibharsha Singha of Solmari village and unanimously resolution adopted on it. It was under the circumstances that a demand for setting up Degree Arts college arose some years back to cater the needs of a large number of aspiring youths along with the responsibilities of 10 (ten) Gaon Panchayat areas with the population of about 1.25 Lakhs. A group of social workers, educationists of the locality viz. Late Kiran Ch. Nath, Late Bhabendra Narayan Ray, Sri Hemen Ray, Sri Sushil Kumar Roy, Sri Padma Bahadur Gurung, Sri Jaychandra Nath, late Sirish Das, Sri Dhiraj Das, Sri Dhaneswar Das, Sri Dibya Lochon Das, Late Subhash Kalita, Late Nalini Bala Das, Smti Kanika Das, Late Dharani Das, Late Arabinda Das, Late Nripen Das, Sri Sushil Rabha, Sri Motilal Rabha, Sri Kiran Rabha, Sri Tapan Das and many other enthusiastic people were always in active participation to push forward and to fulfil the noble dream of the greater locality. Among them, Sri Padma Bahadur Gurung and Sri Sushil Kr. Roy had carried the pain of being the Secretary and President of the Governing Body accordingly. Mr. Hareswar Sutradhar, M.A., B.T. (Retired Principal, J. N. M. H.S. School), Late Karuna Kanta Rabha, M.A., (Retired Principal, Dudhnoi College), and late Rohit kr. Sarma, M.A., M.Phil. (Retired Professor, Goalpara College) has shouldered the responsibility of the college as Principal till 31st July, 2005 accordingly after departure of Dr. Monoj Kr. Chakraborty.

However, the college is presently imparting education in its permanent self-ownership land and building. The dream to build a permanent building came true with the upstream co-operation from the members of sponsoring Body of the College, hard labour and whole hearted will of the founder Secretary Late Swahid Ray, a group of sympathetic and enthusiastic people of the locality, financial grants from local MP and MLA funds i.e. Drupad Buragohain (Ex M.P. Rajya Sabha), Anowar Hussain (Ex. M.P. Dhubri Constituency), Sri Jyotish Das and Sri Dulal Ghosh (Ex. M.L.A. Goalpara East Constituency respectively) along with local bodies like Kalyanpur Gaon Panchayat and Rabha Hasong Autonomous Council helped the college for stepping forward to achieve

the goal. Besides the ceaseless effort and dignity of the Governing Body of the college is also noteworthy for the progression of the college.

With the modest beginning in 1996, the college has already celebrated its Silver Jubilee year in a befitting manner. The college has been emerging as a centre of quality education. Yet, it is felt that to meet the future challenges: the college must walk in planned route. It is yet expected that by proper implementation of future plans and programmes, the college will find the new vista in catering the challenges of modern education considering the needs of the region by introducing new vocational and job-oriented skill-based courses. The first batch of students appeared B.A. final examination in the year 1999 and till last year a good number of students completed their Under Graduate Course from this college and rendering services in various fields of the society.

B) Status of the College:

The College is permanently affiliated to Gauhati University and Provincialised by the Govt of Assam. It is registered under the Society Act, 1860.

C) Location of the College:

The College is situated on the southern part of the mighty river Brahmaputra and on east side of the earlier National Highway 37 and presently National Highway 17 between Agia and Solmari in a very natural environment under 13 - Goalpara West LAC. It is located in the Goalpara West Co-District Head quarter and only 12 (Twelve) km away from the District Head Quarter, Goalpara Town. It is on the edge of "Urpada Bill", one of the important tourist places surrounded by infinite beauty.

- d) Extend proper care to develop the aspirants in extra-curricular & Co-curricular activities irrespective of caste, creed, gender etc.
- e) To work for personality development of the aspirants and molding of nation character.

H) Motto:

I) Program of Study:

Agia College offers Four Year Under Graduate Program (FYUGP) of Gauhati University as per NEP 2020.

J) Subjects Offered:

The College offers Major and Minor Course for the FYUGP on the following subjects-

- a) Major course in Assamese, Education, Economics and Political Science.
- b) Minor course in Assamese, English, Education, Economics, History and Political Science.

Along with the above, as per NEP 2020, the college offers the following common courses for the students.

- i) Value Added Courses (VAC)
- ii) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)
- iii) Multi Disciplinary Courses (MDC)
- iv) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

ADMISSION GUIDELINE

1) Admission Procedure:

The candidates who completed HS or equivalent examination have to register themselves in the SAMARTH PORTAL and choose AGIA COLLEGE for admission into FYUGP 1st Semester. College will publish the selection list in the college website on the basis of the applications received through the Samarth Portal and subject to availability of Seats. The Selection list and admission date/dates will be declared in accordance with the guideline of Govt. of Assam. For all the dates candidates have to go through the website of Agia College i.e. www.agiacollege.co.in

2) Eligibility for Admission:

The candidates who fulfilled the conditions laid below are eligible for Admission into FYUGP course at Agia College.

- a) Candidate should pass the HS or equivalent examination from recognized Board/Council/University.
- b) Candidates must pass the HS or equivalent examination on or after 2021. Gap Certificate from the competent authority is required for the candidates having gap period.

3) Availing of Fee Waiver Scheme for Admission:

Students can avail Free Admission under Fee Waiver Scheme offered by Govt. of Assam subject to fulfillment of the conditions as notified by the Govt. of Assam in due course of time.

4) Fee Structure for Admission:

Fees for Admission into 1st Semester Under Graduate course is Rs. 7180.00 (without Practical) and Rs. 7480.00 (with Practical). The fees may change subject to issue of Notification by the Govt. of Assam in due course of time.

FOUR YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM (FYUGP) (UNDER NEP: 2020)

The undergraduate degree (UG) program in the “**Four Year Under Graduate Program**” (FYUGP) is a Choice Based Credit System under Semester Scheme. The candidate has an option to exit after completion of 2nd/4th/6th Semesters of the program (at the end of each academic year) and shall be awarded Certificate, Diploma, and Undergraduate degree with Major/Minor respectively.

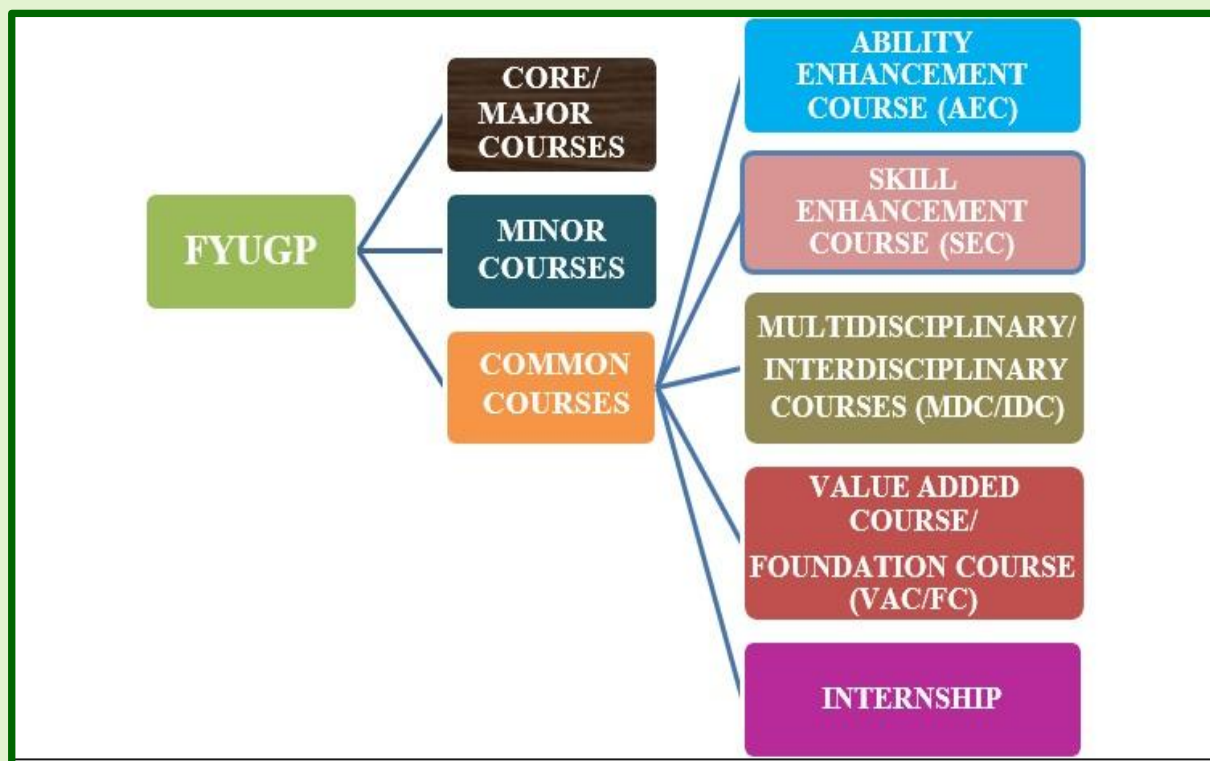
Two consecutive (one odd and one even) semesters will make up an academic year. UG course shall be of eight semesters covering four Calendar Years (Academic Sessions – July to June). The duration of the Odd Semesters (First, Third, Fifth and Seventh) shall be July - December, and that of Even Semesters (Second, Fourth, Sixth and Eight) shall be January - June. Each student must take admission in four consecutive academic sessions starting with the first semester. Students who do not enroll in the second academic session will not be eligible to take admission in the third academic session and fourth academic session respectively. Similarly, a student who do not enroll in the third academic session will not be eligible to take admission in the fourth academic session.

The program permits horizontal mobility in course selections for the students. They may pursue the three years or six semester programs within 5 years and four years or eight semester programs within 7 years. The program allows the students to re-enter the course within a time of 3 years.

CREDIT AND ATTENDANCE

All classes that a student attends are ultimately converted to academic credits. The following should be noted-

- The allotment of a credit for certain paper is for the duration of a semester.
- In GU-FYUGP, all credits are calculated on a weekly basis. One week is a span of days from Monday to the next Saturday. The conversion from credit to contact hour of teaching is as follows:

$$1 \text{ Credit} = 1 \text{ Hour of Theory Class}$$

OR

$$1 \text{ Credit} = 2 \text{ Hours of Practical Class.}$$

c) The 'Theory Class' can be any of (i) A Teaching class in a classroom, (ii) A Tutorial Class 'Or' (iii) Assignments.

d) The Practical class can be either (i) A Practical Class conducted in a Laboratory 'Or' (ii) A Project Work.

IMPORTANT ADDITIONAL INFORMATIONS

- ❖ Credit is to be earned by the students in full and not in fraction
- ❖ Gauhati University set minimum 75% attendance in class as the requirement to earn full credit.
- ❖ Without 75% attendance, the students will be debarred from attending in End Semester Examination.
- ❖ The debarred students will continue their studies till final semester.
- ❖ After completion of attending the others External Semester Examination (ESE)s, the debarred students will have to attend the classes to earn the required credits for the debarred semester.
- ❖ Only then, they will be allowed to appear in both Internal as well as the External Semester Examination of debarred semester.
- ❖ Internal Assessment will ideally account for 40% of the total marks allotted to a course / paper.

CONVERSION TO CLASS HOUR

It is expected that in the course of a Semester, a minimum of 11 (eleven) weeks of classes should be conducted. So, a 4 credit theory course should have a minimum of 44 hours of teaching in a semester which roughly translates to 44 one-hour theory classes. The following examples explain this conversion in detail for a whole Semester.

(a) A Course with 4 Theory Credits

$$4 \times 11 = 44 \text{ Hours of Teaching}$$

(b) A Course with 3 Theory and 1 Practical Credits

$$3 \times 11 + 1 \times 22 = 55 \text{ Hours of Teaching}$$

(c) A Course with 2 Theory and 2 Practical Credits

$$2 \times 11 + 2 \times 22 = 66 \text{ Hours of Teaching}$$

(d) A Course with 4 Practical Credits

$$4 \times 22 = 88 \text{ Hours of Teaching}$$

Salient Features of FYUGP under Gauhati University

- ❖ The duration of FYUGP of Gauhati University is 4 (four) years UG Program aligned with NEP 2020. In this course a student will have a span of 7 (seven) years to complete FYUGP.
- ❖ The FYUGP of Gauhati University supports multiple exits and entries.
- ❖ The student can exit and enter into the courses maximum for three times – after the completion of 1st (first) year, after the completion of 2nd (second) year and after the completion of 3rd (third) year.
- ❖ Every student who wants to exit before three years from the program must complete an additional Vocational Course of Four credit as Internship.
- ❖ On Exit, a student gets a -
 - Certificate at the end of the 1st year
 - Diploma at the end of the 2nd year
 - Bachelor's Degree with Major/minor at the end of the 3rd year.
 - On completion of 4th year students will get Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research.

Attendance is compulsory for all students in their respective courses to meet the credit.

Medium of Instruction -

The medium of instruction in all subjects is English and Assamese.



FACILITIES OFFERED BY AGIA COLLEGE

Library:

The college provides software-based library and reading room facilities to the students as well as for the teachers with a good quantity of books. In addition to the books supporting the syllabus of each semester, periodicals, journals and newspapers are regularly subscribed to the college library. The students can borrow books from the library using his/her Library Membership Card. For the Library Membership Card, an application to the library should be submitted in the prescribed format obtained from the college library. All members have to follow the rules and regulations of the college library in all respects. Borrowers must return the books within the given period and are personally responsible for the loss and damage of any book borrowed.

Sports and Gymnasium:

The college provides sports and gymnasium facilities for physical training of the students to keep their body and mind fit.

Student's Aid Fund:

This fund is kept to help the economically poor students on the basis of merit, attendance and regular observation subject to the availability of funds. Needy students will have to apply to the principal enclosing necessary certificates from the competent authority and follow necessary procedure framed for this purpose. The settlement is subject to the satisfaction of the college authority.

Common Room:

Separate common room facilities for boys and girls are available including necessary accommodation and time-consuming units.

NSS Unit:

Interested students may join the National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit which will provide them not only the opportunity to render social services both inside and outside of the college but also to develop personality under the guidance of a trained NSS Program Officer. The students may build themselves with the motto NOT ME BUT YOU.

Career Guidance and Counseling:

Agia College provides necessary guidance and information to the students through a Cell namely Career Guidance and Counseling Cell run by the college under the leadership of an experienced coordinator appointed by the college authority.

ICT Enable Classrooms:

Facility of ICT enabled classrooms with audio-visual aids like projectors, various kinds of practical apparatuses, charts, maps etc. are used for wholesome understanding and first-hand experience of the students.

Govt. Scholarship:

The college is listed in the Govt. Scholarship portal (National Scholarship Portal) for scholarship and the students of the college who belong to Schedule Caste, Schedule Tribe(P) & (H), Other Backward Classes, More Other Backward Classes and Minority are awarded Post Matric Scholarship by the concerned Govt. authority on the basis of their application. Students receive the scholarship in their submitted Bank Account directly from the concerned Govt. department.

Students can also avail all facilities like Free Admission Scholarship under Fee Waiver Scheme, Mukhya Mantrir Nijut Moina and Nijut Babu Asoni etc. offered by Govt. of Assam subject to fulfillment of the conditions.

Special Felicitation:

The student who acquires the highest marks among the students of Agia College in B. A. Final Examination without having any arrear/back in any semester, be felicitated every year in the General Meeting held for celebration of the Foundation Day of the college subject to timely declaration of the result by the affiliating university.

Workshops and Seminars:

Workshops and Seminars are organized from time to time by different departments and other prestigious organizations to uphold the intellectual and reasoning capabilities of the students.

Students' Union and Activities:

Agia College Students' Union is a general body of students of this college. Its membership is compulsory for every regular student admitted to the college. The office bearers of the Union are democratically elected for a tenure of one year by the regular members. For all-round development of the students, the Student's Union Body organizes various co-curricular and extra-curricular activities and competitions under the active guidance of a teacher-in-charge and the interested students may participate in such activities. Every valid student may contest for being office bearers of the Students Union subject to fulfillment of the election guidelines. The office bearers of the student's Union have to wear the uniform specially designed for them.

Field Trip and Excursions:

Agia College regularly organizes field trips and excursions for the all-round development of the students. Apart from this, students are encouraged as well as taken to different organizations to take part in different competitions.



GENERAL RULES AND REGULATION

College Uniform:

The students should wear the prescribed Uniform inside the college campus. No student is allowed to attend the classes without the prescribed uniform. The colour code of the uniform for boys is black long pant & light-yellow shirt in summer and with black sweater in winter. Similarly, for girls' black pant (pajama), light yellow Kamij **(should cover shoulder to knee)**, black Dupatta/Worni for summer and black sweater in winter.

It is for special attention that Jacket, Summer Coat, Scarp, leggings are not allowed to wear as college uniform.

N.B. : It is compulsory to wear uniform during the examination period.

Identity Card:

A non-transferable Identity Card is issued to each student in every session for a period of one year containing relevant information of the card holder along with a recent stamp size photograph. The Identity Card is based on the Data generated from Samarth Portal. **Student must carry the Identity Card in the College Campus.**

Maintenance of Discipline:

In matters of healthy practices, the college gives high priority to adhere to the rules and regulations of the college for maintenance of discipline in the college campus. Every student is expected to abide by these rules and regulations. The following rules have been farmed in this direction—

- ❖ Use of Mobile Phone inside the “Academic Block” by students is strictly prohibited.
- ❖ All forms of ragging in college campus are banned as the Agia College is a **Ragging Free Campus.**

- ❖ Consumption of Tobacco, Gutkha etc. are banned in the college campus as the college is a **NO TOBACCO ZONE.**
- ❖ Loitering of students in the corridors and making unnecessary noise is strictly prohibited.
- ❖ Maintaining uniform dress code is mandatory.
- ❖ Students must carry valid Identity Cards in the college days.
- ❖ A student to be eligible for appearing in the University examination must attend 75% of the total lectures delivered in each subject/paper during the academic session. Unsatisfactory progress report will disqualify him/her to appear in the finals.
- ❖ Student's Union or any other Association shall be subject to the rules and regulation of the college administration.
- ❖ The students must keep away from drugs, drinks and such other activities as detrimental to the ever-flourishing academic atmosphere of the college.
- ❖ Students shall park their own bicycle, bike etc. at their own risks.
- ❖ All power of maintenance of discipline is vested with the Head of the institution.

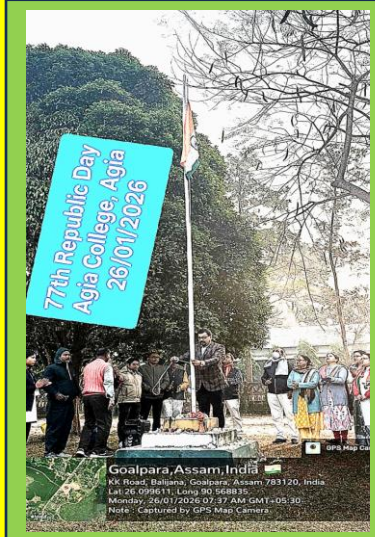
